b. Cheque from Ma-Me-O Beach for AIS

Beverly indicated that Ma-Me-O Beach sent ASVA a cheque for \$1000 for the AIS project. Although most summer villages are making purchasing items for AIS through their MSI funding, the funds from Ma-Me-O Beach are from the general revenue.

ACTION: Beverly is to deposit the cheque and indicate and make a purchase on behalf of Ma-Me-O Beach for an AIS item.

11. Round Table

- Chuck identified that the Cormorants are fishing out the lakes in the NE. A number of lakes are now closed for fishing.
- Pete brought forward the example of fire bans in his area and discussed the issues around how they work.
- Joyce indicated that the sewer line is going in at a cost of \$17/linear metre as opposed to the earlier estimates of two years ago being \$120/linear metre.
- Betty indicated that 5 lift stations went from \$7 to \$2 million from a couple of years ago.
